# Study in Germany

## A Practical Guide for Indonesians





### What is DAAD (German Academic Exchange Service)?

- Non-profit German organization, mostly government funded
- Promoting academic exchange and cooperation between Germany and abroad
- Offering scholarships and grants for studies and research in Germany
- Disseminating information and providing general advice on all inquiries regarding study and research in Germany

### Why choose Germany?

- Strong academic standards and excellent reputation worldwide
- State-of-the-art-facilities
- High qualified teaching staff
- Research at forefront of science
- International degree courses conducted in English
- Very moderate or even tuition fees free
- High standard of living: excellent public services, healthcare, and safety

### Can I study in English?

- Yes! Over 2,300 international degree programs are offered in English
- Most (but not all) undergraduate programs require German
- Most international degree programs at Master level offered in English
- Many opportunities to pursue PhD in English
- Nevertheless, it's highly recommended to learn German

### How much does it cost?

- Most public universities charge little to no tuition fees
- Semester fees range from €170 to €450
- Living expenses are approximately €992 per month

### Work opportunities in Germany

- Non-EU/EEA students can work up to 140 full days (or 280 half days) per year
- After graduation, students can stay for up to 18 months to find a job

### Which documents will I need?

As a general rule, you will need the following documents:

- An officially certified copy of your higher education entrance qualification (school-leaving certificate)
- An overview of your subjects and grades (with official translation)
- Certified copies of your previous higher education certificates, if applicable
- A passport photograph
- A photocopy of your passport (name and photograph)
- Certified copies of language certificates
- Letter of motivation

Please check the specific requirements on the respective university's website.
